Plus, ten practical ways we can make life better for everyone in our city. And yes, I am writing as the leader of your local Labour Party. But no matter who you support, or if you find politics a bore, this is not about politics.

Supporting our children

It is about getting things right when they go wrong. One example is the recent row about free school meals for hungry children during half term in October last year. Remember that? Today many of us fear for our own, and our children's, future.

Creating a thriving hub

Things have gone badly wrong. But they can be put right. Let me explain how. We have lots of jobs but not always the right ones. Too many of us are in low-skilled, low paid, and insecure work. Our employers make money here, but they aren't always rooted in our city. They don't always add to our community wealth. Peterborough can be a thriving hub for the region and a gateway to the East of England. It hasn't happened. Let me show you how it can. Because this neglect is only half our story. The wrong half.
